North Carolina Women's Summit

CBLPI brought together young women from across the country for a time of networking with peers, learning about critical policy issues, and hearing from top women leaders in the nation. The Summit featured speakers with expertise on a wide variety of important issues including Katharine Gorka, President and Co-founder of the Council on Global Security; author and Iraq war veteran Amber Smith; CBLPI Board Member Kate Obenshain; and former United States Treasurer Bay Buchanan. A panel of local North Carolina women leaders had a lively discussion about key issues in their state.

Entrepreneur and Philanthropist Endows \$1 million Lecture Series for CBLPI

Larry Field has created a million dollar endowed lecture program for the Clare Boothe Luce Policy Institute called the Lawrence N. Field Campus Lecture Series. Mr. Field began supporting the young women whom the Institute helps in 1997, with a gift for \$100. He said, "My support for the Luce Policy Institute over the last 19 years reflects a commitment to the education of young women with conservative principles, while also promoting leadership, and fostering personal and professional success for women."

When you ask Larry how he's doing he always says, "Not So Bad," in reference to the name of his business, NSB Associates. NSB is a large real estate company in Southern California, involved in the acquisition and development of more than \$1 billion of real estate in Southern California.

Born in the Bronx borough of New York City, Larry's parents were Hungarian immigrants who ran a grocery store.
